



English

The children will be using the text 'Kassim and the Hungry Dragon' as their starting point to help develop key skills in their writing. Through a range of activities the children will focus on the importance of talk and retelling to improve their creativity and descriptive writing.

After half term we will be looking at spring time poems and writing our own poems.

Children will be writing non-chronological reports based on animals from cold lands.

RE

Children will be learning about Islam.

They will be thinking about what they know already and what they'd like to know.

Children will identify the ways in which Muslims describe God and they will look at objects that are used by Muslims.

Children will learn about Muslim celebrations Ramadan and Eid.

Topic

The children will be looking at the locations of colder climates and developing their map reading and drawing skills.

Science - They will make ice using natural objects and then complete an investigation into what factors cause the ice to melt.

Children will investigate time lines of humans and animals and compare the two.

They will also look at a variety of habitats and identify what makes them suitable and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of animals and plants.

MFL- Children will continue their introduction Spanish and will learn numbers, colours and some conversational phrases.

Computing - Children will be developing their coding skills using Scratch Junior.

Year 2 - Spring Term

Maths

Children will continue to develop their basic skills through daily basic skills lessons.

Children will be working on their addition and subtraction skills.

They will also be learning about division and multiplication.

They will complete a data collecting survey and work together to interpret the data and compile a graph of their results.

Children will be working to identify fractions $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$.

Children will be learning to tell the time, calculate time intervals and developing their skills to measure length, weight and capacity.

Trips

The children will be invited to take part in the Lambing trip to Home Farm – where they will learn about lambs and hopefully see some lambs being born.

Art

Children will be looking at the art work of Paul Klee and then producing their own interpretations.

Children will use clay to make their own dragon.

Children will use sugar cubes and icing to make their own igloos.
