Here are some topics which you can work from at home. All work can be recorded in a way that you choose.

Write a set of rules that everyone in the class should follow at all times.	Create your own resource to help you with your number bonds to 10 e.g. bead string, pegs on a coat hanger, cut out a pair of hands.	Create your own home workout. Think about how many different things you have to do and for how long.	Design an umbrella. Think about what materials would be best and what you might want it to look like.	With your parents' permission, use different materials to create a den. Read some stories together inside your den.
Write a set of instructions for making our breakfast in the morning. Think about the equipment that you would need.	Write down the days of the week and the months of the year and write your own birthday in full. What is the date today?	Tell us about your favourite sport. Why is it your favourite and how often do you do it?	Create a documentary about your favourite animal.	Write your own song that you would want to teach your friends. Are there any dance moves to go with it?
Write a book review about any book that you have at home. Think about your likes and dislikes, favourite characters and favourite part.	Get a selection of different sized containers. Fill them up with cupsful of water. Which one needed the most cupsful?	Practise moving around in different ways, pretending to be an animal. Can anyone guess what you are pretending to be?	Draw a tree in each of the four seasons. What happens to them? You could use your 2020 calendars to help you.	Create a collage of any landscape using natural materials you can find at home.
Research some facts about an author that you know of.	Using a stopwatch, see if you can count to one minute with your eyes closed. Can you get it to stop on exactly 60 seconds?	Create your own Zumba style routine to your favourite song.	If you have the materials at home, can you recreate the lava lamp experiment? Google what you need if you are unsure.	Make your own instrument and use it when you perform the song that you have written.
