Home Learning 6 - Theatre

Here are some topics which you can work from at home. All work can be recorded in a way that you choose.

English	Maths	Physical	Science	Creative
<u>Capital letters, conjunctions and full stops</u> Write a letter to a friend inviting them to come to the theatre and watch your favourite story, explaining what the story is about.	<u>Shape and Measure</u> Can you find 6 items around the house and order them from lightest to heaviest?	Hot potato! Use a soft ball or a rolled-up sock and pass to each other as quickly as possible!	What materials would you find in the theatre? Name and write as many as possible.	Make puppets to re tell a story/film of your choice.
<u>Handwriting</u> Can you write a list of your favourite films focusing on your handwriting and letter families (remember these are in your phonics folders).	<u>Number up to 125</u> Count in 2's, 5's, and 10's as far as you can go.	Create your own end of show finale, think about music and dance moves.	Can you find a way to make your puppets into shadow puppets ?	Design a poster of your favourite film/story.
<u>Questions</u> Think about what questions you would ask your favourite characters from a film/story and write them down.	<u>Number bonds</u> Play the 'Hit the Button' game to practise your number bonds to, or up to, 10. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button	Act like an animal from a story, think about how they move, do they slither along the floor like a snake? Or walk on all fours with heavy steps like a bear?	Using a torch, what different shapes can you make with your hands to create shadows. Can you name the shapes?	Gather the family and act out the film/story of your choice. You can record it and watch it back.
<u>Phonics</u> Write a poem with your chosen sound and try and think of as many words that rhyme with the sound. Example: boy, joy, toy, annoy.	<u>Addition and subtraction</u> Using a deck of cards or numbers written on paper, split them into 2 piles. Pick a number from each pile and make an addition or subtraction number sentence. Repeat.	Play a game using a balloon. Can you keep it from touching the ground? You can use hands and feet or just your feet to make it harder.	Can you predict what might happen to a balloon if it is left in the same place for a week? Write down any observations that you make.	Can you draw or paint the face of your favourite character? Can anyone name the character you have drawn?

Please continue to support your child's learning by reading daily and using the phonics folders, as well as practising their spelling words and putting them into sentences on the back of the sheet.
