Home Learning 5 Circus and Fair grounds

Here are some topics which you can work from at home. All work can be recorded in a way you choose.

English	Maths	Physical	Science	Creative
Design your own circus character. Draw a picture of them. Think of adjectives and sentences to describe what they look like.	<i>Circus tickets.</i> <i>Children £5.00</i> <i>Adults £10.00</i> <i>(these can be 5p and 10p instead)</i> Work out how much it would cost for you and your family to go to the circus. How much would it be if you went with your friends?	See if you can make your own clown dance. Include 3 frozen/still positions in a tall, medium and low height.	Use a magnet off the fridge. Go around the house see what other object you can find that the magnet will attract to. What do you notice?	Make a poster to encourage people to come to the circus. You will need to include where it is, when it is and the cost. Lots of pictures will make it look fun!
Make a fact file on your character. Write down their special circus skill, things they like and dislike and how they act.	You buy candy floss at the circus costing 46p. How many different ways, using coins, can you think of to pay for it?	Can you juggle? Hula hoop? Think about what your circus skill would be. Practise it and put on a show.	Get a large piece of paper (the back of wrapping/wall paper will probably be best). Lie it on the floor. Get someone to draw around you. Measure your height, how long your arms, legs, feet are. Decorate it to make it look like you.	Make model of a fair ride or the circus big top/tent using things you find around your house e.g. yoghurt pots, boxes or Lego etc.
See if you can think of a story with your character in. Tell it to the people in your family. Draw a story map of it.	Quick adding in your head. Get 2 (or 3) dice. Roll them and the first person to add then up correctly gets a point. The first person to get 10 points is the winner.	Choose your favourite song and make up a dance routine to go with it.	They don't have elephants in a circus anymore but they used to. Find out and make a mind map of information all about elephants. What do they need to survive?	Music. Make up your own circus song.
Write down your story. You could add pictures to go with it.	Make circus or fair picture only using 2D shapes. Draw around things in your house to help e.g. a tin for a circle.	Yoga – Cosmic Kids YouTube channel have some great yoga sessions.	Materials. What material would it be best to build a circus tent from. Test different materials to find out if they are waterproof.	Bunting. Decorate some triangles of paper and stick along a piece of string to create your own bunting.
