Here are some topics which you can work from at home. All work can be recorded in a way you choose.

Alphabetical Order Write some topics on scrap paper or lollipop sticks. Choose one and write an A to Z list of things that match that topic. Check that spellings are correct and use capital letters for proper nouns.	Take One Number Select a number – it can be as big or as small as you want.  Now explore what you can do with that number? Can you double it? Halve it?  Add or subtract 1 or 10 or 100 or more to it?  Multiply it by 10, 100 or 1000? Draw it? Show it in different ways?	Build a bug hotel	Write a list of the top 5 largest countries in the world and find out what their population is.	Sketch your landmark!
Growing Sentences Write a simple sentence: I made a cup of tea. Now write it again but add some more information: Yesterday, I made a cup of tea. Keep going: Yesterday, I made a hot cup of tea for my mum. Keep going!	Make a Boardgame Get mathematically creative - make your own boardgame. How many different aspects of maths can you include in it? Think about games you know to make yours even better – then challenge someone in your family to play it with you.	Take time to sit in your garden or by a window and listen to the noises what can you hear?	Spain- find out about its national costume – use illustrations.	Identify 3 football teams from different continents and draw their kits. Make sure you write down which country and continent they are from.
Mysterious Door Imagine (or do an image search) a door. Where is it? In a tree? In a wall? Hidden behind the curtain of your bedroom? Now write what happens to you when you go through that door.	2D Shapes Go on a hunt for different flat shapes around your home and garden. Can you draw them, name then, write down their properties and sort them into groups? How many different shapes can you find?	Build a landmark!	Spain - find out about a festival or something that is celebrated.	Create a poster advertising your favorite holiday destination.
Happy News Be on the lookout for good things that are happening – both locally and elsewhere in the world. Produce your own Happy New News Paper with stories about all of the good things that are happening around us.	Co-ordinates Draw a grid (or if you are brave enough, mark one out on the floor). Add labels and then challenge people at home to a game of Battleship. Other games you can play on grids include Four in a Row and Tic Tac Toe.	Find your shadow and create and animated show to entertain your family.	Complete the A-Z challenge. Can you find towns or cities in the United Kingdom that start with the letters of the alphabet.	Write an acrostic poem about your favorite country.
