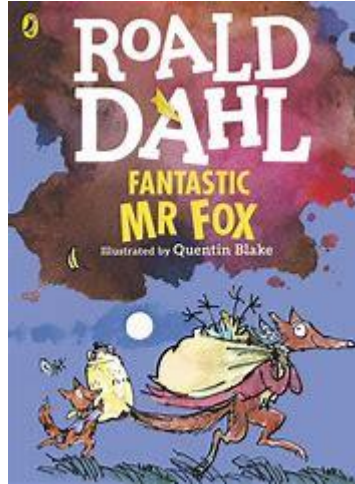


Each day we put a 'Word of the Day' on the grid below. See if you can:


- *Find the definition*
- *Use the word in a sentence*
- *Practise writing this word in your neatest handwriting.*
- *Can you think of any other words which have a similar meaning?*
- *Challenge – Can you draw a picture that represents the word*

Below is the grid for this week, structured into days and lessons. We have also included extra resources, further maths challenges and extra websites at the bottom. All work can be recorded in a way you choose and the challenges set are open to your own choice.

Monday	filthy	<p>The three farmers are all very similar but also have their differences. Can you draw a picture of each of the farmers and write some words to describe them?</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Can you write a sentence or some sentences for each of the farmers?</i></p>	<p>Looking through some pages of the story, can you find any words that have the 's', 'ss', 'ce' or '-se' sound in them?</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Can you think of any other words that have these sounds in them? Can you use the correct sound when spelling these words?</i></p>	<p>Here are some numbers: 1, 4, 8, 10, 16, 20</p> <p>Can you choose two of these numbers to create a subtraction number sentence and work out the answer?</p> <p>e.g. $10 - 1 = 9$</p> <p>Remember that the greater number must go first in the subtraction number sentences.</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Can you choose 6 numbers of your own between 0 and 20 and do the same thing again?</i></p>	<p>Mr Fox uses his sense of smell to avoid getting caught. Can you find out how many different senses humans have and what they are used for?</p> <p><i>*Challenge – Can you draw a human body and label it with the senses ?</i></p>	<p>Cut out each of the characters (saved below in resources) or draw your own and stick onto a lolly stick (or some sticks from the garden/daily walk) and act out the story.</p> 	<p>Joe Wickes PE lesson.</p> <p>Google 'Joe Wickes P.E.' and it should take you to his YouTube videos of his daily P.E. lessons.</p> <p>Choose a day and have a go.</p>

Can you think of any more examples of alliteration? Could you make a story title which includes alliteration and then write the story, e.g. Dangerous Ducks, Gruesome Goats?</p> <p><i>*Challenge- Can you plan your story thinking about what would happen in the beginning middle and end?</i></p>		<p>Bunce, Bean and Boggis have a shop to sell the birds that they farm.</p> <p>See Maths Resources Tuesday for the sheet, there are some questions about the birds and their prices. Using your knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, can you work out the answers to the questions?</p> <p><i>*Challenge: See challenges on the sheet below.</i></p>	<p>Can you look on a local map (google maps or an atlas/road map if available) to find local farms and forests near you?</p>	<p>Create your own fantastic Mr Fox mask. You can be as creative as you like. There are a few ideas below.</p>    <p>The mask outline is saved in the resources section below if you wish to print it out and use it.</p>	<p>Over the next 3 days you have two challenges to complete. The spotty dog challenge and the baby shark scissor challenge.</p> <p>Spotty dogs Challenge</p> <p>This is where you stand with one foot a step in front of the other and jump on the spot and swap your front leg to the back and back leg to the front.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bfh4SY6zT8M</p> <p>Baby Shark Scissor Challenge</p>
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<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);">Wednesday</p>	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);">tattered</p>	<p>From reading the story, can you create a story map of the key events of what happens in the story?</p> <p><i>*Challenge- Can you re-write the story in your own words remembering to focus on the key events?</i></p>	<p>Looking through some pages of the story, can you find any words that have the 'ed' grapheme at the end of them? Once you have found them, can you sort them into two groups: words that make the 'd' sounds or the 't' sound?</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Can you think of any other words that have these sounds in them? Can you use the correct sound when spelling these words?</i></p>	<p>Play the game 'Toy Shop Money ' and have a go at using coins to make different amounts: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/money/toy-shop-money</p> <p><i>*Challenge- Choose the option 'Mixed Coins' and see if you can complete this challenge.</i></p>	<p>Farmer Boggis only ever eats boiled chickens and dumplings each day. Do you think this is a healthy diet? What does diet mean?</p> <p>Can you create a new healthy meal that Mr. Boggis could eat?</p> <p>(This could be drawn on paper plates/circular paper?)</p> <p>See Science Resource below for template</p> <p><i>*Challenge- Can you say which food groups the food in your meal belong to?</i></p>	<p>Follow the steps and learn how to draw your own fox.</p>  <p>See a bigger version in creative resources below.</p>	<p>Lie on your back. While keeping your legs straight lift your feet about 15-20cm off the ground. Open your feet until they are shoulder width apart. Open them and bring them together for 10 seconds. 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<p>Thursday</p>	<p>fantastic</p>	<p>Can you think of any synonyms for 'fantastic'? These are words which have a similar meaning.</p> <p><i>*Challenge – Can you create new sentences from the synonyms you have thought of?</i></p>		<p>Every year Fantastic Mr. Fox likes to give his friends a subtraction challenge to work out his age.</p> <p>Can you work out his age by completing the subtraction questions and finding the odd one out? The odd one out is the answer to how old he will be on his birthday that year.</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Can you create your own challenge that tells your friends how old you will be on your next birthday?</i></p>	<p>FANTASTIC YOU! Mrs Fox says “We are all different, but there is something fantastic about that....”</p> <p>We are all fantastic in our individual way. What makes you fantastic?</p> <p>Have a think about this and talk to your family.</p> <p>Are you a kind friend? Are you hard worker? Do you try your best? Do you have a talent?</p> <p>Make a poster and draw/write the things that make you fantastic.</p>	<p>Fantastic Mr. Fox has a few different front covers:</p>  <p>Can you design your own front cover? Remember to include the title of the book, the author and the illustrator – you!</p>	<p>Challenge your family to have a go too.</p>

Were they different in any way? This week's number is: 34</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Can you pick your own number and do it again?</i></p>	<p>Hereford is a city, but Boggis, Bunce and Bean live in the countryside. You find most farms in the countryside.</p> <p>Can you research the differences between living in the city and living in the countryside? See pictures below.</p> <p>Think about what you would be able to see out of your windows, what you would be able to hear and what you would be able to smell.</p> <p><i>*Challenge: Would there be any similarities?</i></p>	<p>The foxes are tired of being hunted by the farmers.</p> <p>They want to create an underground safe house for them to get away to.</p> <p>Can you design a safe underground house for the foxes?
