

Here are some topics which you can work from at home. All work can be recorded in a way you choose. The theme for this week is **A Squash and a Squeeze** by Julia Donaldson. (click <u>here</u> for an online version of the text or <u>here</u> for a video of the story being read aloud).

Each day we put a 'Word of the Day' on the grid below. See if you can:

- Find the definition
- Use the word in a sentence
- Practise writing this word in your neatest handwriting.
- Can you think of any other words which have a similar meaning?
- Challenge Can you draw a picture that represents the word?

Below is the grid for this week, structured into days and lessons. We have also included extra resources, further maths challenges and extra websites at the bottom. All work can be recorded in a way you choose and the challenges set are open to your own choice.
