## Sports Premium Report Planned Allocation (2020/2021)

For the academic year 2020/2021 Lord Scudamore Academy was allocated £21,050 sports funding from the government to enhance the P.E. provision of the school. This funding is given to all schools and the amount is based upon the number of pupils on roll. This will be allocated and evaluated as follows:

## Impact - Effect of the premium on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment.

Lord Scudamore Academy has used the Sport Funding to employ a specialist PE teacher to teach across all year groups within the school. This has ensured that high quality teaching and learning has taken place, and therefore high-quality PE lessons have been consistently taught in Lord Scudamore Academy.

Due to Covid restrictions in place this year, things have been a little different. Class teachers have benefitted through the use of a specialist coach as he provides continuous CPD. Class teachers are able to watch lessons, which in turn, increases their knowledge base, understanding and confidence to teach PE. Additionally, we were lucky enough to get a coach in from Stride to perform gymnastics CPD to all teaching staff in the Autumn term and then we also had an external cricket coach into school in the summer term who also provided CPD for our staff members.

The addition of new equipment has aided staff to deliver units of work which hit key end points – therefore really progressing the children's learning. Gymnastics requirements are very broad across both KS1 and KS2 and we now have the resources to successfully deliver the full range of the curriculum.

Unfortunately, the majority of events were cancelled this year due to Covid restrictions, however we were able to compete virtually, where possible, to ensure children were included in the Herefordshire School games. In the summer term, we were lucky enough to hold our HMFA Year 3/4 Boys Football Tournament which was an extremely enjoyable event in all who participated. Hopefully next year, we will get back to hosting and attending regular sporting events.

Swimming progress of each pupil is now recorded using a swimming passport. Pupils use their passport right the way through the school, collecting stickers when they achieve a badge. The use of the passport allows us to gain an accurate and precise understanding of those children who meet the National Curriculum requirements by the end of year 6, which has been difficult in the past.

In the Summer term we were able to start introducing after school clubs once again. We provided 5 after school clubs in total across the week – Year 5/6 Football, Year 5/6 Summer Sports, Year 3/4 Boys Football, Year 3/4 Girls Football and Year 2 Multi-Skills. These were held by both the specialist coach and class teachers. These clubs have been full to capacity across the school.

The impact of horse riding and fly fishing last year improved the confidence of the children involved and encouraged them to join after school sporting activities – we were hoping for the same this academic year but due to the circumstances these were not able to go ahead. We will be touch with them again in September to arrange sessions for academic year 2021-2022.
