Sports Premium Report Planned Allocation (2021/2022)

For the academic year 2021/2022 Lord Scudamore Academy was allocated £21,000 sports funding from the government to enhance the P.E. provision of the school. This funding is given to all schools and the amount is based upon the number of pupils on roll. This will be allocated and evaluated as follows:
