- Valuing the voices and contributions of all families and working in partnership with them to support an inclusive school culture.
- Equipping pupils to understand and respect difference, preparing them for life in a diverse local, national, and global society.
- Making inclusion a golden thread that runs through every aspect of our school's activities.
- Continuously improving staff knowledge and understanding of anti-discriminatory practice, equality, and diversity through training and reflective practice.
